THE DOORWAY TO OPPORTUNITY 1913

In last November's newsletter, I recorded part of the history regarding a book that was published on the Town of Dorchester in 1913. I ended the article, *To Be Continued*

Here is the rest of the story. Hope you enjoy. Phyllis

Note: W. D. Garrison had 10 years' experience in farming and was the manager of the Clemson College Coast Experiment Station at Jedburg thirteen miles from Dorchester for five years at the time of this letter.

Another letter included in the book was signed by T. A. Patrick. In this letter written to Albermarle Real Estate Corp., he states that he has been engaged in business in Dorchester for five years and has had considerable success in farming.

The last page in the book states: "Dorchester is an incorporated town, and has a well-organized public school with an able corps of teachers. Churches of several Denominations are located near the Town. A number of Mercantile Establishments. Saw Mills, A Cotton Gin, Grist Mill. Other Business Enterprises and Prospects of a bank in the near future."

I had the opportunity to visit him on many occasions and he always enjoyed showing me the newest pictures of his family.


He was a devoted father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. He was also a proud Navy Veteran. Mr. Herman was a dear friend and will truly be missed.


